Play in Nursery

The importance of play

- Helps children learn about themselves and the world around them
 - Allows them to explore different interests and passions
- Encourages interactions, sharing, and socialisation to help develop social-emotional skills
 - Develops important life skills
 - It is a chance to have fun
 - It develops creative and is a chance to be spontaneous
- It gives children an opportunity to create original ideas and act on them
 - They become engaged and develop concentration skills.

What does that look like?

Continuous Provision

These are the resources available to the children at all times e.g. wooden bricks, cars, cosy corner etc. We may enhance these learning resources, depending on what we observe the children to need, want and enjoy. e.g. we'll put key words in the water area, people in the mark-making area

Child-led learning

We have our plans, overviews, subjects but surrounding these stipulated subjects, is the rich learning environment the children have access to during the whole school day. They access these areas to consolidate and build upon their own learning in their own special way - that's the magic of Early Years

What will we be learning?



Key points to remember with learning in Nursery:

- Learning needs to be fun
- Learning is flexible - these plans are not set in stone. They can and will be changed if needed
- Child choice/ preference will allow the child to be more engaged in their learning
- Learning through play is the basis of the framework because research has shown this is how children of this age learn best

Beginning and End of Day Procedures



Children will enter through the Nursery gate and will enter through the main nursery door. Staff will be there to greet the children each morning.

At the end of the day children will leave through the main entrance (12pm) and the playground doors (3pm). The end of the school day is 3pm.

Beginning and End of Day Procedures



Pupils will only be released to a familiar adult over the age of 16, if you wish your child to be collected by somebody different, please inform the school office at the earliest opportunity so they can get the message to the Class Teacher by the end of the day.

- You can pay an additional charge for 3pm - 3.20pm.
