Continuous Provision

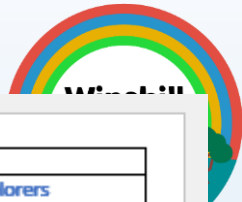

What will we be learning?



Key points to remember with learning in Reception:

- Learning needs to be fun
- Learning is flexible - these plans are not set in stone. They can and will be changed if needed
- Child choice/ preference will allow the child to be more engaged in their learning
- Learning through play is the basis of the framework because research has shown this is how children of this age learn best

Beginning and End of Day Procedures



- Children will enter through the Reception Gate.
- Mrs Stringer /Mrs Friend or another member of the Reception team will greet you and your child every morning.
- At the end of the day children will be dismissed from the playground, please wait behind the barrier.
- Pupils will only be released to a familiar adult over the age of 14, if you wish your child to be collected by somebody different, please inform the school office at the earliest opportunity so they can get the message to the Class Teacher by the end of the day. If someone different comes to collect we will have to phone the contact on the contact list before dismissing the child.

Boys and Girls

PE Kits



- White or red T-shirt, black shorts, black pumps.
- Outdoor trainers and black or grey jogging trousers.
- School jumper or cardigan or red school hoodie.
- Long hair must be tied back for safety during a PE lesson.
- Jewellery is restricted to one pair of plain ear-studs, however these must be removed for PE.

OPAL



Please ensure your child brings wellies and waterproof clothing to school for OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning). All items should be clearly labelled with your child's name and kept in a separate bag that can be left on their peg. This will help your child enjoy outdoor activities comfortably and stay dry throughout the day.



Water Bottles/Bags



Water Bottles

- Pupils in Years N - 6 should bring a water bottle to school each day.
- Pupils will get the opportunity to re-fill their bottles with water during the school day.

Bags

- Bags should be small enough to hang on a peg along with their coat.

They need therefore personal pencil cases should stay at home.

All school meals must be pre-ordered in advance via the My Child at School App.

- Orders must be placed by Friday at 12pm each week for meals for the following week.
- All orders and payments must be made via the My Child at School App.

Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils are entitled to Universal Free School Meals, so there is no need to send a packed lunch.

It allows us to record observations, photos, and comments, and enables you, the parents and carers to view and contribute their own posts, fostering a strong partnership between home and school and providing a record of a child's educational journey.

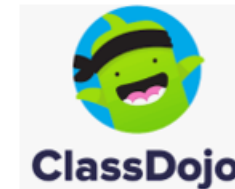
1. Download the ClassDojo app for iPhone or Android.

- Class Dojo is an online platform designed solely to support and communicate learning at home and in school.
- Class Dojo is not a social media platform and must not be used as such.
- Comments on posts should always remain positive, supportive, and focused on learning.
- All messages to staff about anything other than home or school learning should be emailed to win-office@win.jtmat.co.uk or parents should contact our main school office on 01283 247570.
- Parents are expected to follow the guidance in the "What Can Parents Share" section of the Class Dojo Guide.
- Staff will use Class Dojo only between the hours of 8:30am and 4pm, Monday to Friday. There is no expectation for staff to access the system or reply to messages outside these times.
- During class time, teachers' priority is the teaching and learning of the children. They will therefore be unable to respond directly to messages during lessons.
- Please do not assume that a teacher has read a message during learning time.
- Any messages requiring immediate attention should be directed to the school office using the contact details provided above.

Homework

- All children are asked to read at home at least three times per week - the children will bring home a library book and a book we have shared at school. This book will be linked to their phonics
- Please can all parents sign their reading diary.

Key take-home messages

- Please label all items your child brings into school
- Please only send your child with what is necessary for school
- Please sign up for your Tapestry accounts so we can begin showing you their amazing learning
- Please ensure you read with your child every night and sign the reading diaries
- Please ensure reading diaries/ folders are brought back daily containing reading diaries, library book and phonic books
- Please can we kindly ask that any resources and equipment that are set up in the reception outside area are not touched by children as they enter and leave school via the reception door



Most importantly if you have any concerns, niggles or even (what you may consider) a silly question, please just ask. Myself or another member of our team will always be here to help.
